Our church school activities will begin at 9:45 a.m. After worship, we will have a covered dish picnic on the church grounds.






Women of the Church News

Cloud of Witnesses: The Community of Christ in Hebrews

The Letter to the Hebrews is a significant book of the Bible, and is also significantly different from every other book in the Bible. It consists of thirteen chapters, all of which are packed with theology, metaphor, comparisons, and spirituality. Therefore, I've decided to approach the letter thematically, not sequentially. We will explore nine major themes, relate those themes to other parts of our faith tradition, and tie them together with the overarching motif of community. The community for which the letter was written interacts, in a sense, with all the communities of which you are a part, because you bring those groups with you wherever you go—they have helped to form you into the person you are. The community in which you study and worship, your family and friends, social and therapy groups . . . all are part of you.

Our prayer is that the study of community in Hebrews will help us strengthen our own communities.

Reverend Rummage Begins Work with Fairmont Presbyterian Church in October

Dear Second Presbyterian Family:

Over the last eight months we have been in conversation with Fairmont Presbyterian Church about ways our two congregations can work together. Both congregations are discerning the possibility of forming a new church union in order to grow our ministries in the future. This process will take on a sense of urgency in September when Reverend Randy Hall retires from Fairmont.

Beginning Sunday, October 1, 2017, I will be assisting Fairmont with their interim process. I will provide worship support and Session leadership as we prayerfully discuss the possibility of merging our two congregations. This arrangement has been approved by both our Session and Fairmont's Session as well as the Committee on Ministry for Salem Presbytery.

My duties will include the following:

Moderating their Session Preaching and Worship Leadership Pastoral Care and Visitation Interim Tasks and Mission Study Merger Discussion and Discernment

This will be a shared ministry where I will be preaching and leading worship at both churches. Both congregations will use this time for regular fellowship and worship gatherings as a way to strengthen relationships.

This is an exciting time for our church! We are seeking to embrace creative ways to continue flourishing and growing in the future. TROPICAL STORM HARVEY

Situation

Harvey made landfall late Friday and early Saturday am as a category 4 hurricane, and though downgraded now to tropical storm status, remains dangerous as it continues to churn inland into Texas. Damage in and near Rockport and Port Lavaca, where the storm made landfall, was catastrophic. There is one reported death and massive damage reported, and the flood event is continuing as the storm is dumping heavy rains in South Texas. The storm is forecast to continue to produce heavy rains, with serious flooding into the middle of the week.

PDA Response

PDA continues to be in touch with presbytery leadership in New Covenant, Mission, and South Louisiana Presbyteries. National Response Teams are being deployed into the affected regions when it is safe to do so.

Second Presbyterian Response

We will be receiving a special offering for Presbyterian Disaster Assistances in the near future. We will also be in contact with PDA about other ways our congregation can help our brother's and sisters in Houston with recovery.

Special Funds of the Church

In our bulletin you may have noticed a few designations for special funds. These are opportunities to give to special ministries in the church above and beyond your tithe.

Memorials:

These are gifts given in memory or honor of a loved one or friend. They are utilized at the discretion of the Session.

Hunger:

This is our special offering we receive during the school year which supports the Backpack Food Program for South Lexington School.

Music Ministries Fund:

Donations to the music fund are used to purchase music and supplies for the adult choir, the children, the handbell and choir chime choirs. Disbursements are made at the discretion of the Director of Music.

Organ/Music Equipment:

Donations to the organ/music equipment fund are used for the purchase and repairs of musical equipment. Disbursements are made at the discretion of the Session with input from the worship committee, director of music, and organist.
